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Mombasa: City on the Southeast coast of Kenya, Africa. Pop.: ±2 million.

Diani Beach: 17 kms-long beach south of Mombasa, populated by resorts and bar-restaurants

The Swahili Coast: Stretch of land along the Indian Ocean, going from Southern Somalia down to the border between Tanzania and Mozambique. It also includes Northwestern sections of Madagascar.

Luhya: The largest ethnic group in Kenya (14.3%). A family of 19 Bantu tribes totaling ±9.8 million people.

Tilapia: Fresh water fish popular for aquaculture in Kenya.

Maharagwe: Traditional Kenyan beans stew, often cooked in coconut broth.

Mishkaki: East African beef-and-vegetables kebabs barbequed over charcoal.

Makai: In Kiswahili it literally means "Corn".

Hakuna Matata: In Kiswahili it literally means "no worries". (Kiswahili is the name of the language; Swahili is the name of the people)
